The Cost of Discipleship:

I am sure that many of you have heard of Dietrich Bonhoeffer, the German Lutheran theologian who wrote a series of reflections on the Sermon on the Mount entitled, *The Cost of Discipleship*. In his reflections Bonhoeffer maintained that discipleship requires that we make a fundamental decision to follow Jesus and to accept the consequences of that decision.

His own religious convictions led him to stand up to the tyranny of Nazi Germany and to participate in a plot to assassinate Adolf Hitler. The plot was uncovered, Bonhoeffer was apprehended, and the ultimate "cost" of discipleship was exacted of him: he was hanged by the Nazis on April 9, 1945.

While discipleship might force some people to decide between life and death, few of us will be asked to pay that ultimate price. But for us here in our coastal and hinterland parish I think it is important that we never underestimate a person's ability to respond to the invitation to discipleship. And never, never underestimate the potential cost of discipleship.

If today's Gospel is any guide to go by, discipleship involves pretty clear, unhesitating, unambiguous and complete commitment from anyone who takes seriously this invitation.

There can be no "but first . . . , no "in a minute", no "on second thought."

Jesus' Gospel is not a collection of pious words we commit to memory, but a perspective and attitude by which we live our lives. We cannot be disciples by being mere spectators of God's presence; possessing a baptismal certificate alone does not mark us as disciples of the Risen One.

This weekend, authentic discipleship calls each one of us to become involved in the great drama of life that occupies our hours and days. Discipleship takes place not somewhere else but precisely in our homes, classrooms, office spaces and between friends. It is there that the hard work of making the reign of God a reality is lived out and experienced. However young or old we are, discipleship means having the courage to make the sometimes tough choices — regardless of the cost, regardless of the difficulty, regardless of the sacrifice.

May God's grace accompany our discipleship as we live this coming week.

Proper of the Mass

First Reading: 1 Kings 19:16, 19-21 Second Reading: Galations 5:1, 13-18 Gospel: Luke 9:51-62

The 2022 St Vincent de Paul Society's Winter Appeal will be conducted in the Parish over the weekend of the 25 and 26th of June. This Year's Winter Appeal theme is "Make it Stop" focusing on the importance of providing safety to families and individuals fleeing domestic violence.

Reports of domestic violence have increased during the pandemic and with the current shortage of affordable accommodation, many people, including women and children are compelled to sleep rough – on the streets, in parks, cars and tents while trying to escape a dangerous environment. Everyday members of our 5 Parish St Vincent de Paul Conferences come into contact with people who are experiencing domestic violence and associated homeless..

Accessing affordable accommodation has become more difficult as a result of the pandemic. House prices and rents have risen exponentially, leaving many struggling to afford permanent accommodation. These are individuals and families many who have previously been able to manage. They are part of the increasing number of people seeking assistance from charities such as St Vincent de Paul.

Envelopes for your donations will be available at masses on Appeal weekend. All funds raised locally will be used by Parish Vincentians to provide emergency services for members of our communities who are experienced hardship.

Next Sunday 3 July: Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Sunday

Next Sunday is also the start of Naidoc week where we celebrate the great gift that the first nations people to our country. As part of **NAIDOC WEEK**, **Saturday 9 July** a screening of interview by Archbishop Coleridge with Dean Parkin, Director of "From the Heart' at the Archdiocesan Endorsement of the Uluru Statement.

Because the term *ordinary* in English most often means something that's not special or distinctive, many people think that Ordinary Time refers to parts of the calendar of the Catholic Church that are unimportant. Yet Ordinary Time is far from unimportant or uninteresting.

Ordinary Time is called "ordinary" not because it is common but simply because the weeks of Ordinary Time are numbered. The Latin word *ordinalis*, which refers to numbers in a series, stems from the Latin word *ordo*, from which we get the English word *order*. Thus, the numbered weeks of Ordinary Time, in fact, represent the ordered life of the Church—the period in which we live our lives neither in feasting (as in the Christmas and Easter seasons) or in more severe penance (as in Advent and Lent), but in watchfulness and expectation of the Second Coming of Christ.

Thus for Catholics, Ordinary Time is the part of the year in which Christ, the Lamb of God, walks among us and transforms our lives. There's nothing "ordinary" about that!

Likewise, the normal liturgical colour for Ordinary Time—for those days when there is no special feast—is green. Green vestments and altar cloths have traditionally been associated with the time after Pentecost, the period in which the Church founded by the risen Christ and enlivened by the Holy Spirit began to grow and to spread the Gospel to all nations. So, until the 20th of November, which is the Feast of Christ the King and signals the end of the liturgical year - enjoy Ordinary Time!

Sacred Heart Feast Day

The first Feast of the Sacred Heart was celebrated on August 31, 1670, in Rennes, France. From Rennes, the devotion spread because of the visions of St. Margaret Mary Alacogue (1647-1690). In all of these visions, in which Jesus appeared to St. Margaret Mary, the Sacred Heart of Jesus played a central role. Her experience during the octave of the Feast of Corpus Christi, is the source of the modern Feast. The Sacred Heart of Jesus represents not simply His physical heart but His love for all humanity. Preface for the Feast: "For raised up high on the Cross, Christ gave himself up for us with a wonderful love and poured out blood and water from his pierced side, the wellspring of the Church's Sacraments, so that, won over to the open heart of the Saviour, all might draw water joyfully from the springs of salvation." With the Feast Day falling on June 24th, this Sunday 9am Mass at Sacred Heart, Maleny, will be their opportunity to celebrate their parochial Feast Day.


