The End That Matters

There is a familiar adage which says, "Everything that has a beginning will have an end." This year's liturgical calendar ends next week. There is a time to come and a time to go. There is a time to start and a time to end. We can, therefore, say that nothing is permanent.

Is this world going to end one day? The answer is YES. The end of time is one phenomenon that is unsettling for many people. Many people are so troubled by it that they become paranoid. The truth is that the world will end, but nobody knows exactly when that will happen. The world began from God and will end in God. Hence, God is the real end just as He is the ideal beginning. We ought to focus on God because the world belongs to Him and He alone will determine its end.

The Gospel Reading (Luke 21:5-19) presents us with a more fearful description of the end of the world. Some people were admiring the temple and all the beautiful things in it. They were admiring the adorned external elements of the temple and our Lord calls their mind to order and instructs them:

"All that you see here - the days will come when there will not be left a stone upon another stone that will not be thrown down."

This statement is an indirect way of saying that there will be an end to everything including all the great and beautiful things of the world. The people expressed their amazement over what they considered impossible; that is the destruction of the temple.

This discussion led Jesus to give his disciples an instruction not to fear:

You will be hated by all because of my name, but not a hair on your head will be destroyed. By your perseverance, you will secure your lives.

The fundamental truth is that there will be an end of everything. But there is hope because while there will be destruction of the visible, there will also be the salvation of souls. Most of us would agree that a serious student will be more concerned about reading well and studying in order to take care of any approaching examination, thus ensuring success. From the Christian life point of view, we may see that many people are worried about the end of the world instead of being concerned about living good Christian lives. Sometimes those who live disorderly lives are afraid of the end because they do not have good works to show.

The words of Jesus are not meant to make us fearful about the end which will come at God's own time. It is rather an invitation to us to continue to live good lives and bear good fruits. It is an invitation to us to persevere no matter the situation that may be confronting us. It is an invitation to us to know that while everything visible will end, something will remain; namely our souls. It is an invitation for us to be like the good student who is more concerned about reading well than the fear of the approaching examinations.

As we gradually move to the end of this liturgical year, may God give us the grace to be more concerned about living good lives and producing more deserving fruits than looking for a sign and wonders especially about the end. The real end of everything is in God, and if we remain in Him we shall be saved.

The role of the six ministry area leaders will be to support the different leaders of specific Ministries in each of our worshipping communities.

This is an exciting time in the life of our parish because we're laying the foundations for a mission-orientated parish structure which will empower and release people's gifts as missionary-disciples.

We are all missionary: take-home message from Summit

"Events such as last week's Parish Summit are golden opportunities to ensure diverse voices who often don't get the opportunity, are heard around the table," said Fr Joshua Whitehead, Our Lady of the Rosary Parish Administrator, who organised the event in collaboration with Evangelisation Brisbane.



Since becoming Administrator of the parish in August this year, Fr Josh has been on a mission himself to re-fire Catholic

mission himself to re-fire Catholic imagination and invigorate a renaissance of life and ministry in the parish. As one of the largest parishes across the Archdiocese of Brisbane, Our Lady of the Rosary Catholic Parish has more than 1000 parishioners from across eight different worshipping communities, including Caloundra, Maleny, Beerwah, Little Mountain, Currimundi, Kawana, Landsborough and Unity College at Caloundra West.

"Our mission is very explicit," Fr Josh told those gathered at the Summit in his opening address. "We are inspired by the ministry of Jesus to go out and make

disciples by providing encounter opportunities that lead to transformation."

Fr Josh said that organising the Parish Summit was a deliberate effort to allow parishioners' voices to be heard, for the Church to listen and to provide discussion and workshops around discovering what God is calling each and every one of us to do in our parish.

Some comments when asked to explore the topic of what their own dream was for the parish included, "To be a parish where everyone knows each other by name." "My hope and dream is for everyone to be a leader, to open their hearts and be their best selves."

"Everything we aspire to do should be done in love, generosity and in the fruits of the Holy Spirit. I would hope that everyone in their worshipping communities would identify at least one person they've never seen before and invite them to coffee. That's how I was drawn to the Church."

"We are all leaders and we can all be driven by a missionary impulse by being unafraid to ask, kind to each other and trusting that every person can bring something to the table."

During the day, seven key themes emerged on what parishioners could work together to move towards in realising the strategic vision and plan of the parish. They included belonging, spiritual nourishment, Sacramental preparation, communication, welcome and inclusiveness.



A parishioner from Kawana, told parishioners the next day that

"The Summit was not what she expected.

"We are grateful to Fr Josh for inviting us to participate, and we are now more acutely aware of our role as missionaries as a face to young people and the broader Catholic mission and Community.





"After a year of pandemic church closures, it's been more than three years since our community has met, but after yesterday, we

are more determined than ever and we have organised our first meeting at Kawana next week to discuss how we can go forth and be leaders in our Catholic

ministries."


