Responding to God

I often experience a grateful little swelling in my heart when I hear of people in the parish responding to different opportunities to either **gather**, **learn**, **serve** or **give**. The significant number of Maleny parishioners who have given their time, organising the centenary celebrations this weekend is a prime example. Another great response can be found in the three Alpha courses starting at this time. All three Alpha locations – Little Mountain, Caloundra, and Landsborough – are full and we've even had to call in extra volunteers to assist; what a terrific response!

Friends, responding to opportunities to gather, learn, serve or give, is, in essence, responding to the voice of God, **who never ceases to invite us** to desire *more* in our faith journey, and that's what we celebrate this Sunday. Sure, on **Word of God Sunday**, you'll see the lectionary – the book containing the Sunday readings – enthroned and given extra reverence, but the book is merely a sacramental symbol of the deeper reality of God's presence, the Word, who became flesh in the person of Jesus.

While the Bible, which contains God's Word, is our primary means of not just knowing about, but getting to know the person of Jesus, the Word of God is beautifully alive and active in other ways. Thousands of years ago, the ancients looked at the world around them and noticed an order or set of rules in the way the world worked. For Christians, this order was known as the Logos/Word: "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God" (John 1:1). Psalm 147 also offers a beautiful example of this physical *order*: "[God] sends out his word to the earth… He showers down snow white as wool… The waters are frozen at his touch; he sends forth his word at it melts them." "And the Word became flesh, and dwelt among us" (John 1:14).

On this Word of God Sunday, I invite you to a renewed curiosity and desire for discerning God's living presence in your life. This might find expression in a commitment to pray with Scripture daily for the season of Lent, starting in ten days; it might mean sitting quietly in prayer each day, repeating name of Jesus on your lips and in your heart (did you know that 'Jesus' is the only name which contains the Divine presence it signifies? What a beautiful, wonderful and powerful name it is!). Finally, a renewed curiosity for discerning God's presence – which is to say, a desire to Encounter Jesus – finds chief expression in simply asking for it in prayer! May God bless you with curiosity.

2024 Lenten Mini Mission

International TV Journalist, and Catholic Evangelist, Jo Hayes – who is leading our Lenten Mini Mission from 19-21 Feb at OLR church – is launching a new website resource on Lectio Divina, in time for Word of God Sunday, 4 Feb 2024. Perfectly timed to coincide with the Pope's Year of Prayer, <u>lectiomeditatio.com</u> is a practical what/why/how to the ancient spiritual practice of Lectio Divina - 'divine reading'. "The Catholic Christian tradition exhorts members of the faithful to regularly read, and pray with, the Sacred Scriptures. Yet many fail to do so, mainly because they've never been shown how - and further, how daily devotional time, in The Word, can radically transform one's life", says Ms Hayes. "My life was powerfully



impacted, 7 years ago, when a religious sister walked me through the steps of Lectio Divina. "Since that first day, I have committed to a daily practice of, minimum, one hour, reading, meditating and studying the Sacred Scriptures. I am convinced, firstly because The Word of God says so, and secondly, through my own lived experience, that intimacy with Scripture equates to intimacy with Christ. And a life overflowing with Holy Spirit power."

LECTIO MEDITATIO, the name of the new website, guides users through 4 steps of Lectio Divina - reading, meditation/contemplation, prayer and activation. Ms Hayes says step 4, which isn't typically included in traditional Lectio Divina formats, is an important step in allowing The Word to 'come alive' in our lives. "The Word of God, when implanted in our hearts through prayerful reading and meditation, is meant to practically transform our everyday life experience, through activation." Ms Hayes, who has spent the past 15 years working as a broadcast journalist, in both mainstream and Catholic television and radio, travels extensively around the world as a lay evangelist, teaching and speaking on the power of Sacred Scripture, and the crucial importance of daily time with The Word of God.

Our Caloundra Mini Mission will **begin with 9am Mass each day, followed by a short cuppa at 9.30am** and the **one-hour session** with Jo. The same content will be offered each day up at Stella Maris church, Maroochydore with a 4.30pm Mass followed by a 5-6pm session. You can find out more about Jo at *www.johayes.com.au*

Know your Faith: This is a regular weekly session Thursdays 5-6pm in the PC. Content is guided by Fr Francis, with our **current program** being the (re)introduction to basic tenets of the Catholic faith using the text **'At Home with God's People'**. Topics include Scripture, the Church, the Papacy, Authority and Wisdom, Mary and the Saints, the Eucharist, the Mass, Sin and Forgiveness and Ministry and Mission among other subjects.

Faith Circles: Faith Circles are small groups gathering for particular purpose, examples include the Women's Faith and Friendship group and current Bible Study groups. John Manion at Kawana, Carol Devcich at Landsborough, Julie Borger at Maleny and Caroline Kettle at Caloundra are all running small group Scripture studies that are open to all. You may be keen to run your own small group – please let us know how we can support you.

Ash Wednesday

Wednesday 14th February is Ash Wednesday, the first day of the season of Lent. It is designated by the Church as a day of fast and abstinence, as is Good Friday. In current Catholic practice, fasting means having only one full meal a day. Alternately smaller quantities of food may be eaten at two other times but no food should be consumed at any other time during the day. The law of fasting applies to people from 18 to 59 years old.

Abstinence is the practice of abstaining from the use of certain kinds of food. Everyone aged 14 years and older is bound by the law of abstinence from meat.

The practice of fasting and abstinence aims at leading us to interior conversion by making us more disciplined and more charitable. We fast in order to share our time and our treasure with an attitude of love towards God and others. In addition, the practice helps us imitate the example of Jesus who fasted for 40 days in the desert.

The ashes that are marked on our foreheads on the first day of Lent are a symbol of humility, purification and sorrow and remind us of the need to repent of our failings.
