A Further Baptism

In this reflection, Fr Richard Rohr, a prominent Franciscan Priest and writer on the topic of spirituality, encourages us to recognize the presence of the Holy Spirit, a gift God has already given us! Why, however, are we reading about the Holy Spirit on Corpus Christi Sunday? Because while Jesus left us his Body and Blood, it's the Holy Spirit who empowers us to be transformed into what we consume.

"When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place. And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. All of them were *filled* with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability" (emphasis added) – Acts 2:1-4.

It's a shame that the Holy Spirit tends to be an afterthought for many Christians. We don't really "have the Spirit." We tend, I'm afraid, to simply go through the motions. We formally believe, but honestly, there isn't much fire to it. There isn't much conviction. There isn't much service. We just sort of believe. That's why in the Gospels there are two clearly distinguished baptisms. There's the baptism with water that most of us are used to, and then there's the baptism "with the Holy Spirit and fire" (Matthew 3:11); that's the one that really matters.

The water baptism that many of us received as children demands little conviction or understanding. Some parents simply do it to make their parents or grandparents happy. Until this baptism by water becomes real, until we know Jesus, and we rely on Jesus, call upon Jesus, share and love Jesus, we're just going along for the ride.

We can recognize people who have had a second baptism in the Holy Spirit. They tend to be loving. They tend to be exciting. They want to serve others, and not just be served themselves. They forgive life itself for not being everything they once hoped for. They forgive their neighbours. They forgive themselves for not being as perfect as they would like to be.

Even though we so often pray, "Come, Holy Spirit," the gift of the Spirit is already given. The Holy Spirit has already come. We all are temples of the Holy Spirit, equally, objectively, and forever! The only difference is the degree that we know it, draw upon it, and consciously believe it. All the scriptural images of the Spirit are dynamic-flowing water, descending dove or fire, and rushing wind. If there's never any movement, energy, excitement, deep love, service, forgiveness, or surrender, we can be pretty sure we aren't living out of the Spirit. If our whole lives are just going through the motions, if there's never any deep conviction, we aren't connected to the Spirit. We would do well to fan into flame the gift that we already have.

A reflection on The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ

The most logical day to commemorate the gift of the presence of Christ's body and blood in the Eucharist would be the day on which the Eucharist was instituted - Holy Thursday - but that day is part of the Easter Triduum and its focus is not on the institution of the Eucharist but on the Passion.

The Thursday after Trinity Sunday was chosen for the celebration of the feast of Corpus Christi, as it was originally known. In countries like Australia where it is not a holy day of obligation, the feast is celebrated on the Sunday after Trinity.

The second of the two Prefaces set down for the feast gives us an insight into its real meaning: "Nourishing your faithful by this sacred mystery, you make them holy, so that the human race, bounded by one world, may be enlightened by one faith and united by one bond of charity."

When we eat and drink the Body and Blood of Christ, we ourselves are transformed more perfectly into the presence of the risen Christ. This is Christ's gift to us, but it is also a challenge, because it calls us in turn to give our own body and blood to others so that they too might be nourished.

Urgent Community Alert: Proposed Anti-Discrimination Bill 2024 Dear Parishioners,

We face a significant challenge with the introduction of the Anti-Discrimination Bill 2024 by the Queensland Government, which proposes stringent restrictions on religious freedoms. This bill could greatly impact our ability to operate in alignment with our faith values.

Key Concerns:

- Restrictive employment standards for religious organisations.
- Invasive secular definitions of 'genuine occupational requirements'. Disproportionate limitations on our religious practices.

We Need Your Action:

1. Get Informed: Review the legislation explanation summary and/or the detailed submission on the bill provided by our Joint Faiths Working Group. You will find that information on our website.

2. Contact Your MP: Voice your concerns to ensure our religious freedoms are protected. When MPs receive dozens of letters on an issue, they realise how important it is. Please take 5min to voice your concerns

FAOs: What is SYNOD24?

In three months' time, our Archdiocese will be holding a Synod to reflect upon and implement the decrees that came out of the Plenary Council. SYNOD24 is about discerning action plans that will help the Archdiocese implement the areas of focus (Decrees) that came out of the Plenary Council. SYNOD24 will be held on two days in September and two days in October, where approximately 150 people representing the diversity of the Archdiocese will discuss, debate and vote on the proposed practical and measurable actions plans. - Plenary Council Decree 7 requires all dioceses and eparchies to have a synod by the end of 2025. SYNOD24 is our response to this requirement. You can download all Plenary Council Decrees here: https://aobsynod2024.com/plenary-council-resources/
- SYNOD24 honours the significant level of broad consultation, listening and discerning that has taken place over the course of the Plenary Council journey (since 2018) and is the next step of this process. Consultations over March, April and May have been focused on voices that had not been heard previously, voices of those on the margins, experts and experienced practitioners. This is to ensure the action plans are practical and measurable, that they reflect the needs of our Archdiocese, and that they truly reflect the responses submitted throughout the Plenary Council process.
